Administrative Procedure – School Library Bill of Rights

School libraries are concerned with generating understanding of American freedom and with the preservation of these freedoms through the development of informed and responsible citizens. To this end the School District will use the Library Bill of Rights of the American Library Association which follows:

To provide materials that will enrich and support the curriculum taking into consideration the varied interests, abilities, and maturity levels of the pupils served.

To provide materials that will stimulate growth in factual knowledge, literary appreciation, aesthetic values, and ethical standards.

To provide a background of information which will enable pupils to make intelligent judgments in their daily life.

To provide materials on opposing sides of controversial issues so that young citizens may develop under guidance the practice of critical reading and thinking.

To provide materials representative of the many religious, ethnic, and cultural groups and their contributions to our American heritage.

To place principle above personal opinion and reason above prejudice in the selection of materials of the highest quality in order to assure a comprehensive collection appropriate for users of the library.
